

Takeaway: 7 Lakes yields **healthier lakes, great return** for \$8K investment

## Upshot

- \$8K to 7 Lakes = 0.8% of Rome's municipal budget. Town's \$36K total contribution to lake issues = 3.6% of municipal budget. 85% of Rome's tax base is on the water.
- 21 YCC projects on Great, Long, North ponds → 41 erosion-control best management practices. Doesn't include 5 projects & six BMPs on East Pond ... which flows into North Pond → Great Pond → Long Pond.
- **0 new infestations or known introductions** of invasive plants in the lakes.



## Upshot

- >\$300K in grant funding for erosion control on Great, Long, North ponds in 2022-23. Grants will be leveraged to double infrastructure investment (roads, driveways, culverts, bridges). GREAT return on \$8K contribution.
   Will apply for more grants in 2023-24 for all 3 lakes.
- More than 1K water samples collected, tested, analyzed.
  Good management necessitates understanding.
- Seeking increased contributions from all other towns in the watershed except Rome, which doubled its contribution in 2022. Thank you!

## **ROI: Invasive aquatics**

- 18 Adopt-A-Shoreline & Plant ID workshops
- 3 locations (Belgrade, Smithfield, Oakland)
- 50 new Adopt-A-Shoreline volunteers
- 16 miles adopted
- 3 invasive plant paddles
- 5 CBI trainings

# Each = increase over 2021 activity.





### **ROI:** Invasive aquatics

#### 6,228 boat inspections

- 837 North Pond
- 738 East Pond
- 2,400 Great Pond
- 1,600 Long Pond
- 648 Salmon Lake

#### 0 invasives introduced





## **ROI: Invasive aquatics**

19 acres of invasive milfoil cleared from Great Meadow Stream

13 acres of invasive curly-leaf pondweed cleared from East Pond's Serpentine & North Pond's Old Mill Stream

0 new infestations found in all waterbodies surveyed





15 crew members – all high school and college students

### **ROI: YCC**





100 BMPs on 50 properties to reduce runoff & erosion. BMPs = riprap, rain gardens, infiltration steps, vegetative buffers, dripline trenches, rubber razors, erosioncontrol mulch.

## Rome

- 12 YCC projects in 2022
- 17 BMPs (best management practices) installed
  - Sand removal, mulch paths, riprap, plunge pool, plantings
- Lakes
  - Great Pond: 14 projects, 28 BMPs
  - North Pond: 5 projects, 9 BMPs
  - Long Pond: 2 projects, 4 BMPs
  - East Pond: 5 projects, 6 BMPs



## **ROI: Erosion control**

Ensuring Our Future

\$793,151 in Clean Water Act grants 2009-2021

- Matched with \$1.58M from road associations, towns, landowners
- Total of \$2.38M invested in Long, Great, East, North & McGrath ponds, Salmon Lake



Funded under Section 319 of the Clean Water Act



## **Return: Erosion control**

Ensuring Our Future

Grant funding in 2022:

- Great Pond \$109,430
- North Pond \$104,950
- McGrath Pond-Salmon Lake \$94,270
- Total improvements = 7 miles of gravel roads and driveways + ditches, culverts, bridge

Infrastructure investment = \$600K in construction spending, including matching funds, when completed

## **ROI: Water sampling**

- Long 285 samples collected
- Messalonskee 258
- Great 211
- East 135

- North 128
- Salmon 114
- McGrath 102


#### Total – 1,233 (as of Oct. 18)

Tested for phosphorus, aluminum, iron, algae, toxic cyanobacteria

## **ROI: Water quality**

## Rome



#### \$36,000 total

- \$24,000 to Belgrade Lakes Association (milfoil mitigation, courtesy boat inspections, "other water quality issues")
- \$8,000 to 7 Lakes Alliance (Youth Conservation Corps on North, Great and Long ponds, "other water quality issues")
- \$4,000 to North Pond Association (courtesy boat inspections, "other water quality issues")



### **Town contributions**

- Belgrade \$40,000 in 2022 → \$60,000 in 2023
  - Rome \$36,000 → \$36,000
  - Oakland \$15,500 → \$18,000
  - Smithfield \$11,000 → \$13,500
  - Sidney \$7,200 → \$8,500
  - Mount Vernon --  $0 \rightarrow TBD$

Contributions are to 7 Lakes and lake associations for invasive aquatics, Youth Conservation Corps, water quality activities.



## Looking ahead to 2023

- \$224,434 in erosion control grants, including \$112,550 on Long Pond. Will yield \$500K investment in erosioncontrol infrastructure with leveraged funds
- More YCC projects across the watershed
- More invasive plant and CBI trainings, more plant paddles, extending CBIs to mid-October, continued vigilance with milfoil and curly-leaf pondweed
- Continued vigilance in water sampling, testing and analysis



## ARPA

- ARPA funds CANNOT be matched with Clean Water Act grants. However ...
- Rome <u>could</u> leverage CWA funds by using ARPA on road projects away from lakes and using funds normally devoted to road maintenance around lakes.
- 7 Lakes still has 2022 Great Pond funds available.
  Applying for more in 2023 to spend in 2024.

## ARPA



Potential projects include:

- Improvements at Town beach + road to beach. Est. \$5K total cost.
- Foss Hill Rd. 7LA could contribute half of est. \$20K cost.
- Nickerson Ln. 7LA could contribute half of est. \$10K cost.
- Oak Hill Rd. Est. \$30K cost. (impacts North Pond)
- Crystal Spring Rd. Est. \$10K cost.
- Turnaround at **sand/salt shed**. Est. \$10K cost.
- 7 Lakes willing to work with Town to prioritize projects, coordinate budgets to maximize available dollars.
